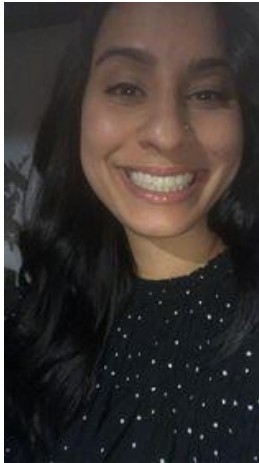
Bryanne-Leigh Brosseuk

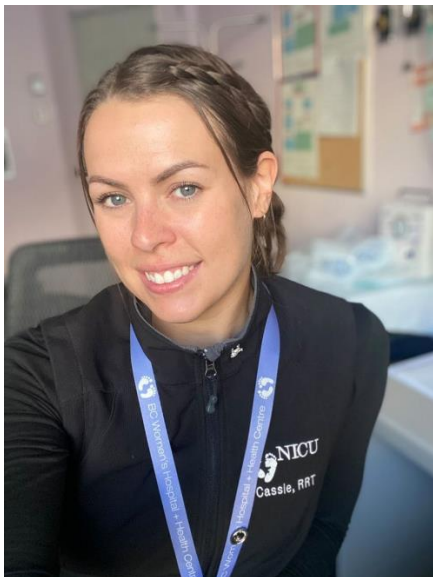
through RCH. Outside of work, I enjoy spending time with my family and my 2 German shepherds or traveling the world when time allows.
